



## **The Arms of the See of Worcester**

*Ar. ten torteaux, four, three, two and one*

A silver (argent) shield with ten torteau (red [gules] roundles) in Pythagorean tetraktys formation, i.e. 10 balls triangular 4 over 3 over 2 over 1. above a bishop's mitre silver (argent)

'Thomas Peverell (1407-1419 is the first Bishop of Worcester whose seal is known to have contained these arms as representing the See.'
